Severe Winter Weather in Colorado/Wyoming Creating Delays in Delivery

A severe winter storm is affecting all modes of delivery in and around the eastern Colorado area, as well as north into Wyoming. Delays are expected for the delivery of mail, newsstand and newspapers to and from the effected areas as up to 24 inches of snow are possible throughout today and into Thursday afternoon. A winter storm warning is in effect for Colorado, Wyoming and Nebraska until Thursday evening; United, Southwest and Frontier have canceled flights out of Denver International Airport because of the blizzard.

Over-the-Road Conditions

Major Interstate Closures:

Interstate 80 closed between Cheyenne and Laramiel-285 closed between South Cobb Drive and Donald Lee Hollowell Parkway.

Eastbound Interstate 70 closed at exit 244, at the bottom of Floyd Hill, due to multiple accidents/disabled vehicles.

US 6 Eastbound Denver-Golden Closed (Milemarker 275.64-276)
